THE RULES - We have just a few

SSSSHHH! HOLD IT DOWN! – Please be respectful to those around you who are listening to the music.

SEAT SAVING – NO seat saving once a set begins. We want to provide chairs to as many people as possible, so if your friends are on the way, they need to arrive before the music starts. Site personnel have been instructed to see that seats are filled ten minutes after a performance begins.

RECORDING – Next to a live performance, the best way to support artists and to hear their music is to buy their CDs. That said, we do not prohibit recording of performances at the West Coast Ragtime Festival; small recording devices for personal use only. Posting videos and photos on social media is permitted and encouraged. But please, respect the artist's wishes if he or she does not want to be recorded or posted.

CELL PHONES – Mute phones before the music begins. Please be courteous and take all phone conversations outside of the venues. Please no flash with cameras or phones. (Cell phone lights are very distracting during the show.) Thank you.

There is storage unit rental, an insurance premium, a PO box, and software programs for bookkeeping and graphics, occasional bank fees, occasional tax fees, and web design and hosting. There are even office supplies like stamps, envelopes, printer cartridges and IRS forms that add up. All of these are in some way related to the festival. We thank all of you who have donated in the past and hope you will continue with your contributions.

We also thank you for your donations to the separate youth fund that keep our youth programs alive and growing.

With 20 kids from around the country playing their hearts out, it is easy to see that the future of ragtime is in good hands. In case you missed it, look it up on YouTube. In fact all four of the concerts are up there. You could possibly spend a whole day immersed in youthful, ragtime bliss.

From the youngest putting their all into performances of teaching rags, up to the tippy top players who are firmly entrenched in the ragtime styles and playing like champs, you won't want to miss a minute. And we promise, that visually, it's all kids from the emcee to all the performers. No "gray hairs" in sight. (We pretty much confined them to the background where their help and support has been much needed and appreciated.)

NICK ARTEAGA

Nick's interest in ragtime began as a teenager in his hometown of Sacramento where he taught himself to play on his grandmother's player piano. Later, after some formal lessons with **Dr. Robert Bowman**, he began performing professionally in a Chinese restaurant, accompanying singers at universities and working as a church musician. Nick began taking ragtime seriously after checking out a Sacra-



mento Ragtime Society meeting around 2011. A few years later he became a regular performer at the West Coast Ragtime and Sutter Creek Festivals. Although Nick specializes in ragtime, he has also introduced ragtime festival audiences to obscure Central and South American syncopated piano music as well as his own intricate ragtime compositions. Besides his musical activities, Nick has helped run his parents investment business in Chico, California, and has also worked in government. He currently resides in Chico, in a small 1920s house that he restored.

AU BROTHERS

Trombonist, Brandon Au, along with his brother Justin Au on trumpet have been playing the traditional jazz of New Orleans ever since their uncle, High Sierra trombonist **Howard Miyata**, turned them on to the music at an early age. Betweem them, they have



amassed three music degrees and performed with various ensembles at Carnegie Hall, Lincoln Center, Preservation Hall, and the Sydney Opera House, as well as at the Monterey, Redwood Coast, Montreux, New Orleans Jazz & Heritage, and North Sea jazz festivals.

Back at the West Coast Festival by popular demand, Brandon and Justin will be teaming up with the **Freebadge Serenaders**, **Neville Dickie**, **Marty Eggers** and **Clint Baker**. You are in for a treat.



JEFF BARNHART

Jeff Barnhart is an internationally renowned pianist, vocalist, arranger, bandleader, recording artist, ASCAP composer, educator and entertainer. His mastery of the classic swing, jazz and ragtime repertoire of the early to mid-20th century has found Jeff constantly appearing as a soloist, band pianist, and with smaller groups—most notably **Ivory&Gold®** with his talented wife,

flutist/vocalist **Anne Barnhart**. His unsurpassed knowledge of the history of America's early pop styles and its best current practitioners, combined with his superior "people skills," has awarded him the position of Musical Director for several acclaimed annual events.

Jeff has played dual piano with such jazz luminaries as **Ralph Sutton, Neville Dickie, Louis Mazetier, John Sheridan, Brian Holland** and **Carl Sonny Leyland**. He has recorded over 120 full-length albums. Reviewer **Jack Rummel** recently summed up the reason for Jeff's popularity, averring, "When it comes to talent, speed, versatility, creativity, mastery of multiple genres and just plain entertaining zaniness, Jeff Barnhart stands alone." www.jeffbarnhart.com

CLINT BAKER

Clint Baker started playing clarinet in 1980. His first school band director needed trombonists and quickly switched Clint to trombone. In the years that followed he would learn additional instruments including tuba, tenor banjo, and drums. He performed at the Sacramento Traditional Jazz Jubilee (later called the "Sacramento



Music Festival") every year from 1988 until its demise in 2017.

In 1990 he created **Clint Baker's New Orleans Jazz Band** (1990–2000). For over twenty years, Clint has led a New Orleans style jazz ensemble, **The Cafe Borrone All Stars**, at Cafe Borrone in Menlo Park. Clint also performs regularly with seven other well-known bands and he is a noted jazz educator.

Clint will appear on sets of others playing bass or tuba or perhaps holding some drumsticks. He is **Ramona Baker**'s father!



RAMONA BAKER

Multi-talented Ramona S. Baker, is the daughter of **Clint Baker** and sister of **Riley Baker**. She is a pianist, historian, collector, artist, and a contributing writer to *The Syncopated Times*. Ramona has been a regular youthful pianist at the West Coast Ragtime Festival since 2012. She has also performed at the Historic Sutter Creek Ragtime Festival

and in 2016, her first trip to the Midwest, performed with **Virginia Tichenor** and Max Morath at the Scott Joplin Ragtime festival. She's studied recordings from 1888 to 1920 for a decade. Her most focused interest lies in the studio pianists and musicians, such as Fred Hylands, Frank P. Banta, and Justin Ringleben. Ramona Baker is well-known to our festival goers for her seminars on these unjustly forgotten figures from the early years of the recording industry. Ramona lives in New York City where she leads tours in the Bowery.

JACK & CHRIS BRADSHAW

By now the ragtime community knows these two very well. Besides appearing at West Coast festivals throughout the years, they have also appeared at the Sutter Creek, Scott Joplin, Blind Boone, Shaniko, Oakhurst, Fullerton Ragfest, and Fresno Flats Festivals,



and in concerts at the Old Town Music Hall in El Segundo. The rollicking road to ragtime has also taken them to eleven states, Canada and Switzerland.

Jack and Chris Bradshaw, with 88 keys and 20 fingers at their disposal, righteously proclaim having the most piano keys held down at any one time — many of them right! Not going for speed, their quest is for clarity and classic ragtime charm as their fingers dance off the keys to Jack's four-hand arrangements of popular rags, cakewalks, marches and novelty numbers. Jack often performs solo, including his original rags.

ISAIAH BURTON

Ilsaiah Burton, 19 and now a sophomore studying piano and composition at Biola University, began to teach himself piano when he was 12 years old. At 14, he began formal classical piano lessons under **Dr. Jana Olvera**, who also introduced Isaiah to the world of ragtime/old time piano music. The first piece he learned was *Dizzy Fingers* by Zez Confrey, which he performed at



the West Coast Ragtime Society Youth Competition and later in the World Champion Old-Time Piano Playing Junior Showcase. This led to his regular appearances as a youth performer at the West Coast Ragtime Society Festival and the Historic Sutter Creek Ragtime Festival. Isaiah's rendition of **Tom Brier**'s rag, *Razor Blades*, won him the Grand Prize and Artist of the Year Award in the online 2021 International Youth Music Competition in the Jazz, Ragtime, and Blues category. Many awards and prizes later, Isaiah was named The Ragtime Kid of 2024 at the Scott Joplin Festival.



MICHAEL

Michael Chisholm of Plantersville, Texas has been a lifelong fan of ragtime since hearing Jo Ann Castle burn up the keys on The Lawrence Welk Show. Castle's hot and rhythmic playing inspired Michael to learn music for himself. Starting with the marimba in middle school, Michael eventually took up piano hoping to play ragtime.

Interest in the woodwind family began not long after that. Scouring the Internet for whatever ragtime music he could find wasn't enough. Taking inspiration from **Elliott Adams** and **Tom Brier**, Michael began collecting vintage sheet music, hoping to find all the ragtime he could.

Since his inclusion on the California ragtime circuit, Michael has had the great fortune of performing at the Sutter Creek Ragtime Festival, West Coast Ragtime Festival, Orange County Ragtime Festival, OTMH Ragtime Festival, and has performed at the Scott Joplin House in St. Louis, Missouri. Michael currently assists with the production and direction of the West Coast and Sutter Creek Ragtime Festivals.

JARED DIBARTOLOMEO

A lifelong enthusiast of ragtime and vintage piano music, Jared DiBartolomeo was first exposed to ragtime at the age of two when his father played the *Maple Leaf Rag.* At age eight, he began formal piano lessons. After receiving a folio of Scott Joplin's rags and some recordings, Jared dove deeper into ragtime enthusiasm. For several years, under the mentorship of ragtime greats **Marty Eggers** and **Virginia Tichenor**, he expanded his repertoire to include the works of other ragtime composers, as



well as novelty piano and stride piano. In recent years, he has focused on the more sophisticated novelty genres of the 1920s, from the early works of such composers as Roy Bargy and Zez Confrey, to the later impressionistic and introspective styles of Lee Sims and Bix Beiderbecke.

Jared has performed at West Coast since 2005 and has had numerous opportunities to perform at San Francisco's Pier 23, plus the Sutter Creek and Santa Cruz ragtime festivals.

NEVILLE DICKIE

A native of England's County Durham, Neville Dickie is among the most accomplished stride and boogie-woogie pianists on either side of the Atlantic. As jazz authority **Tex Wyndham** suggests in his liner notes to Dickie's "Eye Opener," he's "a world-class keyboard shark." A regular performer on BBC Radio, Dickie's made hundreds of appear-



ances as a soloist or with his trio and is one of the few British jazz players to score with a hit single—*The Robin's Return*—in 1969. He continues to be embraced by British jazz enthusiasts and his 1975 album, "Back to Boogie," has sold more than 100,000 copies. He's produced scores of records and can be heard on hundreds of jazz recordings including several recordings with French pianist **Louis Mazetier**. As John Featherstone writes in Storeyville, "Neville Dickie's devastatingly accurate left hand shows why, at any stride convention, he'll have a place reserved at the top table." We are delighted that Neville's recent move to the U.S. has made him more accessible to our ragtime audience.



After spending his formative years playing in pizza parlors and clubs throughout Indiana, Brian discovered the World Championship Old-Time Piano Playing Contest. In 1999, he won his third title and was retired as "undefeated".



Brian has played with some of the hottest jazz bands in the US and has traveled all over the world performing his creative styles of jazz, ragtime, stride, swing, boogie, and blues. He has multiple recordings to his credit, garnering a Grammy nomination in 2006 for his work with Bud Dresser on their album, Ragtime-Goodtime-Jazz – (all available at www. shanesmohawk.com). This year he has a new group, **The Ragabonds**.

Brian has served as Artistic Director for the Scott Joplin International Ragtime Festival, and is currently Co-Artistic Consultant for the Monterey Jazz Bash by the Bay in Monterey.

VINCENT MATTHEW JOHNSON



Vincent seeks to preserve, encourage, and revitalize ragtime, this beloved, quintessentially American music. His pianistic approach is informed by a wide range of syncopated styles, from classic ragtime to stride and early jazz piano, and the novelty piano stylings. As a transcriber he has notated works by **John Reed-Torres** and **Eric Marchese**. He has also judged at the West Coast Youth Piano Competition and at

the World Championship Old-Time Piano Playing New Rag Contest.

As a composer, The New York Times, columnist **John McWhorter** called him "a composer who has taken the torch passed on since Scott Joplin and created ragtime that continues in the **Bolcom** spirit..." Vincent's rags are featured on **Max Keenlyside**'s album, *Invincible Syncopations: The New Ragtime Music of Vincent Matthew Johnson* on Rivermont Records.

Vincent performs regularly at ragtime clubs and festivals throughout California, and is known to moonlight at Downtown Los Angeles' storied 1642 Bar with friends **Eve Elliot** and **John Reed-Torres**.

CHARLIE JUDKINS & MISS MAYBELL

We are delighted that Charlie Judkins and Miss Maybell are again participating in the West Coast Ragtime Festival this year. They share a mutual, lifelong passion for pre-1920s popular music and have complimentary musical skills. With a wink to the pretentious barrelhouse hoi palloi, thus was born, "Miss Maybell" who is accompanied by Charlie.



Adding to Lauren's and Charlie's combined strength is that their repertoire is built largely on obscure songs and verses, happily and skillfully, imbued with life, lilt, and spontaneity to boot. Lauren and Charlie are themselves serious early 78 RPM record collectors. They know, and revere, the details about the recordings of the pioneering composers, instrumentalists, vaudevillian singers, and lyricists, and familiarize themselves with the nuanced vocal and instrumental differences between versions of given songs sung by the same singers on various "takes" and record labels. These are a "not to miss" duo!



KEY SYSTEM RHYTHM RAMBLERS

The Key System Rhythm Ramblers features **Virginia Tichenor** on piano, **Jeff Green** on banjo/guitar/vocals, and **Lisa Gonick** on vocals/ukulele. Playing music of yesteryear—traditional jazz, early swing, ragtime, novelty, and blues—their infectious rhythms will keep your toes tapping, feet moving, and faces smiling!

CARL SONNY LEYLAND

Carl Sonny Leyland is an Anglo-American boogie woogie, blues and jazz pianist. He was born in 1965 near Southampton, England, but as a child was drawn to American music. At age 15, he discovered boogie woogie, and was inspired to make the piano his career. He came to New Orleans in 1988, and built



a reputation in the clubs there for the next nine years. In 1997, he relocated to California, where he joined Big Sandy & His Flyrite Boys, a rockabilly and western swing group, touring with them for three years. Since then his repertoire has included ragtime and early jazz. He formed the **Carl Sonny Leyland Trio** in 2003 with **Hal Smith** on drums (later replaced by **Jeff Hamilton**) and **Marty Eggers** on bass. The trio plays primarily boogie woogie and traditional jazz. It has recorded seven CDs and performs regularly in festivals. Leyland is regarded highly at Jazz festivals and in 2010 was inducted into the Boogie Woogie Hall of Fame.





MAX LIBERTOR

Max Libertor, 16, was born and raised in the suburbs of Los Angeles California. One of five children, he showed a very early love for music. Max had some traditional piano lessons at a very early age, but stopped when he was twelve years old.

During the pandemic his love for music was reignited when he discovered **Tom Brier**'s modernistic and dif-

ficult ragtime. He started teaching himself Brier's music.

This "new ragtime hobby" lasted long past the pandemic and in 2023, he was honored as the Ragtime Kid at the renowned Scott Joplin Festival in Sedalia, Missouri. Max has since performed at festivals such as the Sutter Creek Ragtime Festival and the West Coast Ragtime Festival.

Max is not only a performer, but also a composer, arranger, and multi-instrumentalist. He plays trumpet in the high school concert, marching, and jazz band, and explores many other instruments in his free time.



TJ MÜLLER

T.J. Müller is a bandleader and multiinstrumentalist living in St. Louis, Missouri, where he directs **The Arcadia Dance Orchestra** and **The Gaslight Squares**.

Born in Canterbury, England, T.J. began playing traditional jazz cornet with his family band, led by his fa-

ther, Rev. Anton Müller. While living in Edinburgh, the American touring group, **Pokey Lafarge**, offered T.J. a job. During his time in Lafarge, T.J. performed on The David Letterman show, The Grand Ole Opry, A Prairie Home Companion, and the PBS music documentary, American Epic. Eventually T.J. settled in St. Louis and began working with **The St. Louis Ragtimers**, playing alongside cornet player **Bill Mason**. After leaving Lafarge, T.J. established his own groups and began specializing in the historic jazz music of Missouri. Weekly, T.J. can be found performing around St. Louis, and preaching about good St. Louis music, from Ragtime to Swing.

RICHARD POWERS


Richard Powers is an expert in American social dance, noted for his choreographies for dozens of stage productions and films, and his workshops in Paris, Rome, Prague, London, Venice, Geneva, St. Petersburg and Tokyo as well as across the U.S. and Canada. He has been researching and reconstructing historic social dances for twenty-five years and is currently a full-

time instructor at Stanford University Dance Division. He joined the Dance Faculty in 1992 and serves as a faculty liaison to the Friends of Dance at Stanford organization.

Richard co-founded the Flying Cloud Academy of Vintage Dance (1981) to produce large-scale monthly recreations of Victorian and Ragtime Balls and co-founded the Fleeting Moments Waltz & Quickstep Orchestra.

Richard started and directed the Stanford Vintage Dance Ensemble (1992) and serves as an advisor and choreographer for the Swingtime Dance Troupe.

THE RAGABONDS

The cheerful ragtime combination of piano, banjo, tuba, and drums was first presented on record more than 80 years ago by members of the Lu Watters Yerba Buena Jazz Band (including pianist Wally Rose). Their recording of the "Black and White Rag" caught on and helped to kickstart the first ragtime

revival wave in the 1940s.

In 2024, Brian Holland and The Ragabonds revive the instrumentation - but with plenty of surprising twists! The playlist is a mix of old and new compositions spanning nearly a century, yet sounds fresh and contemporary in these performances by The Ragabonds. Musicians include: **Brian Holland** (piano), **Katie Cavera** (banjo), **Paul Hagglund** (tuba), and **Gareth Price** (drums).

JOHN REED-TORRES



Los Angeles native, John Reed-Torres, a BIPOC (Black Indigenous Person of Color) has performed and lectured at various venues around the USA and abroad, including Old Town Music Hall, the West Coast, Buenos Aires, Blind Boone, Scott Joplin, Orange County, Sutter Creek, and the Oakhurst Ragtime Festivals, plus several LGBTQ variety shows, as well as at various universities.

John has written over a dozen rags, including collaborations with fel-

low Ragtime composers **Vincent Johnson** and **Reginald Robinson** (the first collaboration in ragtime between two African American composers since the early 20th century).

Being of a diverse ethnic heritage, John believes the history of ragtime music has an important place in the development of American musical culture, and the African American diaspora.

He recently was awarded a Certificate of Recognition from The City of Los Angeles. When John isn't driving a metro bus for the City of Los Angeles, he just might be performing with **Eve Elliot**, in downtown Los Angeles.

SQUEEK STEELE

Squeek Steele is globally notorious for her wide-ranging expertise at the piano. Classically trained, she long ago branched out into musical styles like ragtime, honky-tonk, and traditional jazz, as well as composing soundtracks for documentaries, musicals and a folk opera.



She's a sought-after entertainer, playing gigs (in every imaginable musical style) in Berlin, Singapore, Hong Kong, and all over the United States. Her recordings have been selling well for decades.

She's also in the Guinness Book of World Records for "the most pieces of music performed from memory." In 1988, in Philadelphia, she earned this record by playing many hours worth of tunes thrown at her by judges, including rock, classical, religious, world, Broadway, jazz, bluegrass and many other styles. Her record remains today. SQUEEKY KEYS, the documentary about her Guinness World Record is available for viewing on YouTube.

Lily won first place in the Paradise Symphony Orchestra's Young Artists Competition in February 2023 and 2nd place in CAPMT's *Go for the Gold Competition* in May 2023. She was the youngest youth performer in the 2022 West Coast Ragtime Festival. Lily is also a California Arts



Scholar after attending the California State Summer School of the Arts (CSSSA) for piano in 2024. At the National Association of Teachers of Singing (NATS) National Student Auditions (NSA), Lily was a regional semifinalist and a national qualifier. Lily loves improvisation and composition. She has also performed in the Music Teacher's Association of California (MTAC) State Convention's Improvisation Honors Recitals and demonstrated in multiple improvisation presentations by Justin McKay. Lily is a freshman at Chico High School.

Virginia Tichenor has been consumed by ragtime her entire life. She is the daughter of the late Trebor Tichenor, noted ragtime scholar, pianist, collector and founder of the St. Louis Ragtimers.

Always at the crossroads of the ragtime revival, Virginia grew up with legends like Eubie Blake, Max Morath

and Butch Thompson chatting in her own living room. She studied music at the St. Louis Community Association for the Arts and took advanced training from concert pianist, John Philips.

Virginia maintains a busy performance schedule in the San Francisco Bay Area, performing regularly at the American Legion post in Larkspur, CA, the Cheeseboard in Berkeley, CA and at Local Edition in San Francisco. She is pianist for the **Zenith Jazz Band**, **Mission Gold Jazz Band**, **Barrelhouse Jazz Band**, and the **Barbary Coast Jazz Band**. Virginia also plays the drums and is Festival Director of the West Coast Ragtime Festival.



Cincinnatian and Texas native Matt Tolentino is a true multi-instrumentalist playing accordion, clarinet, saxophone, tuba, piano, tenor guitar, banjo, and mallet percussion. Since 2007 Matt has

pursued a career as full-time musician and bandleader preserving and performing the great music of 1895 - 1935 — ragtime, hot jazz, and the roots of swing. His ensembles include the **Singapore Slingers Orchestra** (Dallas), the **New Liberty Dance Orchestra** (Cincinnati), **The Matt Tolentino Band**, as well as a traditional polka band - **The Royal Klobasneks**. He performs throughout the country working to keep this great music alive. Music has brought Matt many adventures and friends. It even brought Matt together with his wife **Danielle** and together they share a passion for America's treasured musical past.



TADAO TOMOKIYO

Tadao discovered the piano when he was three and hasn't stopped playing since! He studies classical piano and horn, but ragtime holds a special place in his heart. He is in his first year at Yale College, where he studies piano with Elizabeth Parisot, plays horn with the Yale Symphony Orchestra, and sings with Redhot & Blue, Yale's jazz a capella group.



Tadao's classical training also includes Interlochen, Tanglewood, and the InterHarmony and Perugia festivals in Italy. He has been named winner of the Three Rivers Young Peoples Orchestras' concerto competition and winner of the Pittsburgh Youth Symphony Orchestra's conducting competition.
